



POST GRADUATE DIPLOMA IN ENVIRONMENTAL LAW AND POLICY

CENTRE FOR ENVIRONMENTAL LAW (CEL)

The Centre for Environmental Law (CEL) was established in 1993 as an integral part of WWF-India. Apart from handling and furthering WWF-India's conservation work involving policy analysis, campaigning and legal interventions on environmental issues, CEL serves as a resource centre for teaching environmental law and research in national, regional and international contexts.

To implement its programmes CEL is building functional and professional linkages with government agencies and non-governmental organizations at national and global levels.

One of the principle educational activities of CEL since 1993 has been the Diploma Programme in Environmental Law that has been running for over two decades now. More than fifteen hundred participants have benefited from the Diploma in Environmental Law Certificate issued by WWF India.

To widen the scope and reach of the Course, since September 2013, WWF has partnered with National Law University, Delhi to offer one year Post Graduate Diploma in Environmental Law and Policy.

With an aim to provide a better understanding of green law issues poignant worldwide, particularly in the Indian context, NLUD and WWF India jointly offer a One Year Post Graduate Diploma in Environmental Law and Policy. The exclusive tailor - made programme provides opportunities for law graduates and other professionals working in the field of environment to enrich their understanding of the issues, institutions and initiatives in the field of environmental law and policy.

Programme Objectives

The objectives of the programme are to:

- Provide comprehensive knowledge to participants in Environmental Law and Policy
- Increase understanding on key issues related to national as well as international environmental law & policies

- Develop knowledge on the International Legal & Policy context on thematic issues related to environment
- Develop practical skills to facilitate effective engagement with Environmental Laws
- Prepare well-informed professionals in Environmental Law and to upgrade the professional competencies by augmenting the Environmental Law awareness
- Promote networking and sharing of experiences among participants to actively contribute towards conservation

Target Group

Eligibility

Graduation in any stream. Work experience, although not necessary, but a minimum of two years in the relevant field is desirable. Admission will be granted strictly on merit and at the discretion of a selection panel. In some cases, the Applicant may be required to appear for a telephonic interview.

Duration and Pedagogy

- Post Graduate Diploma in Environmental Law and Policy is a one-year programme
- The diploma is offered in English as the only medium of instruction.
- All aspects such as course manuals, timelines, examinations and discussion forums will be shared / conducted in the
 online mode.
- There are no online or Physical classes conducted in the PGDELP course.
- Webinars and online discussions will be organized during course duration.

Mode of study

- Mode of instruction will be ONLINE only.
- For undertaking online mode study, participants need internet access.
- All course requirements like discussion forums and exam papers will be posted online.
- Participants will be provided with soft copy of the study/reading material.

SYLLABUS AND DETAILED STRUCTURE:

- The PG Diploma comprises of 32 Credits or 500 Marks.
- The course consists of 5 courses out of which four are theoretical courses and one is a practical training course.
- Courses 1 & 4 will be of 6 credits each.
- Course 2 & 3 will be of 8 credits each.
- Practical training course will be of 4 credits.
- All the courses are compulsory. Participants will be issued certificate only on completion of all courses (course submissions).

Preparation and submission of Project Report

Online Assessment Examination – Open book exam or take-home exam shall be conducted at the end of Course 3 & Course 4.

*While developing the study material, depending on the unit length and issues covered some titles of the units may change.

Evaluation System

• The evaluation is a continuous process through out the course and participants will be evaluated on the basis of discussion forums, examinations, and term end paper/project report.

• Participants are required to submit a Project Report (Term End Paper), which is a part of the 'Practical Training' component under Course V.

Discussion Forum— Participants will have to actively contribute to discussion forums created and managed by Course Coordinators. A topic for discussion will be posted, and the participants are required to share their views on the topic. Discussion Forum is a good platform for sharing of knowledge and ideas. The Discussion Forums will carry 30% weightage of total assessment for each theory course.

Examination – After the end of each Course, the participants have to appear for an 'open book examination or takehome examination', which will be a subjective and / or analytical question paper. The participant will be free to refer to books and study material for solving the paper. The examination will carry 70% weightage of total assessment for each theory course.

Project Report (Term End Paper) – The Project Report component includes a Final Term End Paper paper, where participants are required to work on a topic of their choice. Practical Training (Course V) carries 4 credits or 100 marks. Submission of the Project Report compulsory for completion of the Diploma.

Final Marking

Final evaluation break up is as follows:

Course I to IV - 30% for Discussion Forums and 70% for Examinations

Course V - 100% for Project Report

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

Interested applicants are requested to submit soft copies of the duly filled Admission Form (Annexure 1) along with their curriculum vitae, copies of certificates of qualification (Graduation Degree or final semester marksheet) and statement of purpose.

- 2. Fees will only be accepted once admission has been confirmed.
